How to make tin foil faces

You will need:

Cardboard
Tinfoil
PVA glue
Craft knife
Scissors
Paint
Tissue paper

*Find an adult to do the cutting with a craft knife



Cut your cardboard into an oval or circular shape

Cover one side of the cardboard with PVA glue and stick a layer of tinfoil over the top

Make sure the duller side of the foil is stuck to the cardboard so that the shiny side creates the surface of your mask



Cut any excess tinfoil off to mirror the shape of the cardboard



Turn the cardboard over and wrap any excess foil to the back of the mask

You might wish to cut out eye shapes with a craft knife*

*Ask an adult to do this



Your tinfoil face is now ready to decorate

Possible materials to do this:

Paint
PVA glue
Tissue paper
Sequins
Feathers
