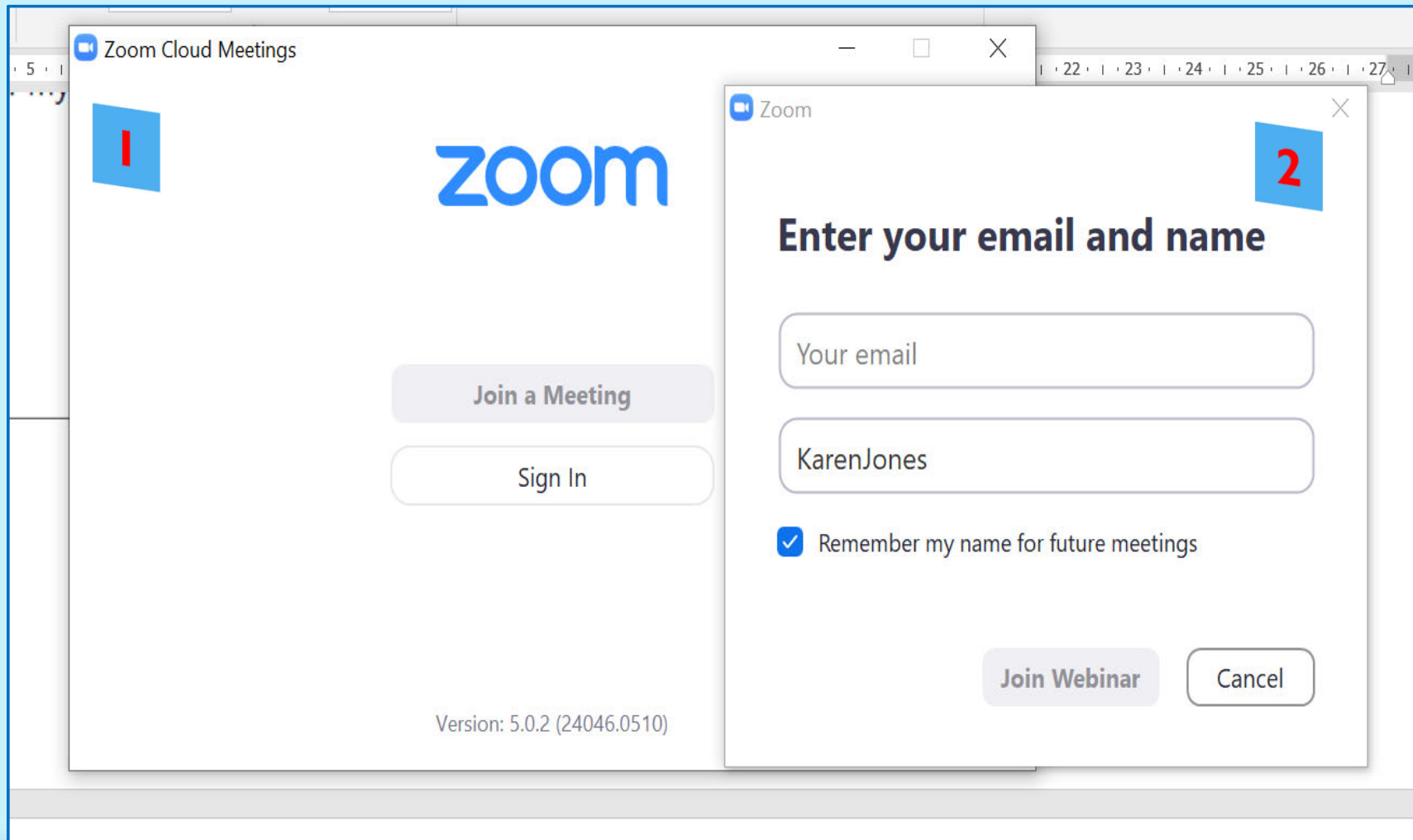


1. This is the Zoom page you will see when you click on the link.


